We celebrated the 100-year anniversary of the Sheboygan County Museum and what a memorable year it was!

Many of you joined us at Nourish Farms for the Centennial Jubilee fundraiser. Over 125 members and guests spent a wonderful evening reminiscing about the past and talking about the future of the museum. In the process, we raised over \$15,000 to support the Museum for the next 100 years. At the museum, our curator Tamara Lange put together a great centennial exhibit *100 Years / 100 Objects: A Century of Collecting* featuring an eclectic array of objects collected in the past 100 years. The theme of 100 was used for another fundraising project "100 years, 100 dollars". This project raised over \$20,000.



Thanks to the staff, museum volunteers, and board members for making these centennial events a huge success. You also might have realized that we are no longer using the full name of Sheboygan County Historical Society and Museum, but rather Sheboygan County Museum. This is just to save everyone time and avoid hand cramps. We also have a great new logo so don't be confused when you see Sheboygan County Museum, it's just us.

Besides celebrating the past, 2023 was a year to look to the future. Our long-time Executive Director, Travis Gross, made the decision to resign and move on. For the last decade Travis has been the face of the organization and successfully guided it through many challenges. His legacy includes leaving the Museum with a great staff, a sound financial position, and a great base of members and volunteers. Thank you Travis and good luck in all your new endeavors.

Our new Executive Director is Brett Lobello. Brett is a long-time museum professional who comes to us from Colorado Springs where he was the Director of Regional History and Genealogy for the Pikes Peak Library District. With ties to Wisconsin, he is excited to be back in our state and is anxious to lead the museum forward into our next 100 years. Welcome Brett.



Hello,

2023 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Exhibitions and Collections

- Curated the temporary exhibition 100 Years/100 Objects: A Century of Collecting at the Museum, highlighting the history and growth of the organization's artifact collection over the past 100 years
- Hosted *Museum Madness* in conjunction with the *100 Years/100 Objects* exhibit, highlighting 16 uniquely Sheboygan County objects, with Mel Hummitzsch's Toilet Seat Guitar beating out past winners Garton Toy Company Kidillac and Jumes Restaurant Neon Sign.
- Created a companion exhibit at Mead Public Library highlighting the 100th Anniversary of the Sheboygan County Historical Society
- Continued progress on the first complete inventory of the Museum's artifact collection, supported by an *Inspire! Grant for Small Museums* from the Institute of Museum and Library Services
- Completed documentation of all artifacts (basic catalog record, identifying photograph, and unique identification number) stored in the Museum's Kohler Loft Storage area, along with approximately half of the lower level Collection Storage



- Inventoried 6,048 objects, ensuring they have a minimum of basic description, dimensions, general condition, identification photo, and location recorded in the collection database
- Curated *Holiday Memories 2023: Holiday Delights* including retrospective displays celebrating the history and Lead Elves of the first twenty years of mechanical animation displays at the Museum



- Accepted over 200 objects from 42 donors, including artifacts from early Hmong community residents, the Wilson Elementary School Sheboygan Sesquicentennial Coat, Aurora Memorial Hospital (including the entire Hospital Chapel interior), Nemschoff, and several other Sheboygan County legacy manufacturers
- Supported the *Prange's Then & Now* event with a temporary exhibit featuring 46 related artifacts
- Provided an artifact display in support of the January debut of the film "The Sheboygan Armory: A Part of the Community"
- Facilitated access to over 250 artifacts for visiting researchers and Museum related programming
- Loaned artifacts to support exhibits at Mead Public Library, Oostburg Public Library, and Sheboygan Falls Memorial Library
- Utilized examples from the Museum's artifact collection to create a program to help the public better preserve their personal collections

Programming and Community Outreach

- Partnered with 39 local organizations a businesses
- Presented the program "Winning the Right to Vote: Woman Suffrage, Sheboygan County and Beyond" for Acuity employees for Women's History Month
- Presented the program "Sheboygan's Own: The Chordettes" for Manitowoc County Historical Society's *Hungry for History* program series





- Held May Basket Making stations, and classes at SCM, Mead Public Library, Plymouth Library, Bookworm Gardens, JMKAC, and Hello Happiness
- Brought history to life during *Prange's Then & Now* showcasing Prange's Department Store objects, photos, snacks, and an open mic alongside a local business market featuring current businesses from downtown Sheboygan. This also featured a Badger Talk about the history and present of local markets
- Hosted interactive booths at National Night Out, Acuity Health Challenge, and Lakeland College
- Reunited historical organizations "post-pandemic" at the Local History Fair
- Partnered with twelve different public display locations from around the county to exhibit Chair City Art Chairs through the summer
- Received support from the United Way Day of Caring allowing us to buy materials and host volunteers in making Holiday Memories Craft Kits
- Hosted the final presentation for the *Telling the Full Story* grant from the Trust for Historic Preservation
- Partnered with fifteen local artists to facilitate the Chair City Art Chair Project, where artists used

- Partnered with nineteen musicians/bands who played at the Artist Garden Party, History Hill Music Festival, Sheboygan Jubilee, Holiday Memories, and Christmas at the Taylor House

- The Full Day Education Program *The Civil War and Sheboygan County*, primarily for fifth grade students, served 360 students, providing 1,800 hours of service to regional students

- Hosted a Membership picnic that had over 200 people attend
- Held three Busy Bee days to prepare hands-on activities for the Full Day Education Programs
