A DAY OF SCHOOL AT THE MUSEUM: JOURNEY TO SHEBOYGAN COUNTY

The students will step back in history and learn about the people who migrated from the eastern United States and who moved from Europe to settle in Sheboygan County in the 19th century.

The historical sequence of the Museum's four full-day programs is *First Peoples of Sheboygan County*, *Journey to Sheboygan County*, *Historic Jobs of Sheboygan County*, and *The Civil War and Sheboygan County*. Each program contains five and a half hours of activities designed to be an integral part of the classroom curriculum, targeting standards in social studies and language arts.

The cost is \$5.00 per student. The full-day programs are available to public, private, parochial, charter, and home school students.
