A DAY OF SCHOOL AT THE MUSEUM: THE CIVIL WAR AND SHEBOYGAN COUNTY

The students will step back in history and learn about the people who lived in Sheboygan County in the years surrounding the Civil War, and how the war affected the lives of soldiers, civilians, and future generations.

More than a “field trip” the students’ visit to the museum allows them to meet classroom objectives while interacting with artifacts to engage their imaginations along with their problem-solving skills.

PROGRAM INFORMATION

The historical sequence of the Museum's four full-day programs is *First Peoples of Sheboygan County*, *Journey to Sheboygan County*, *Historic Jobs of Sheboygan County*, and *The Civil War and Sheboygan County*. Each program contains five and a half hours of activities designed to be an integral part of the classroom curriculum, targeting standards in social studies and language arts.

The cost is \$5.00 per student. The full-day programs are available to public, private, parochial, charter, and home school students. The content and activities in *The Civil War and Sheboygan County* are best suited for upper elementary and middle school students.
