A DAY OF SCHOOL AT THE MUSEUM: FIRST PEOPLES OF SHEBOYGAN COUNTY

The students will step back in history and learn about the earliest inhabitants of the land we now call Sheboygan County and how they used their environment to obtain food, clothing, and shelter. The program highlights historic turning points that brought changes to the area and how Native Americans here adapted to those changes.

More than a “field trip” the students’ visit to the museum allows them to meet classroom objectives while interacting with artifacts to engage their imaginations along with their problem-solving skills.



THE DAY'S ACTIVITIES

The day also includes Problem Solving Activities, a look into Removal and Relocation, and the Making of Treaties as well as Indigenous cultures today.

PROGRAM INFORMATION

The historical sequence of the Museum's four full-day programs is *First Peoples of Sheboygan County*, *Journey to Sheboygan County*, *Historic Jobs of Sheboygan County*, and *The Civil War and Sheboygan County*. Each program contains five and a half hours of activities designed to be an integral part of the classroom curriculum, targeting standards in social studies and language arts.

The cost is \$5.00 per student. The full-day programs are available to public, private, parochial, charter, and home school students. The content and activities in *First Peoples of Sheboygan County* are best suited for upper elementary school students.
